Tauramoko was a descendant of Kupe, from Matawhaorua, and Nukutawhiti, of the Ngatoki-matawharorua canoe.

Te Hauangiangi was the daughter of Puhi, who captained the Mataatua canoe northwards from the Bay of Plenty.

Ngati Hine is an independent member of the Ngapuhi Federation.
